On September 27th, 2008 at approximately 6:49 p.m. I responded to the area of Birmini Lane in reference to an animal complaint. Upon arrival at 110 Birmini Lane I made contact with Debbie Root who advised me that she observed her neighbor shoot a boar hog on the right of way on Birini Lane in the 190 block. D. Root showed me where the neighbor in question resides at. I then made contact with Edward Westervelt at 9 Birini Lane. He advised me that he did shoot the boar hog and further advised that this hog belonged to him and has continued to escape his enclosed fence. E. Westervelt explained to me that he made several attempts to try and corral the hog into his yard at which time the hog became aggressive towards him. It should be noted that this hog weighs approximately 1,200 pounds and has approximately six inch tusks. E. Westervelt advised that once the hog became aggressive towards him that he was in fear that it might harm him and he shot the hog in the head with a 22 caliber rifle. E. Westervelt then dragged the hog to his residence so it could be buried. It should be noted that I observed the dead hog in the back yard that sustained shots to its head. E. Westervelts wife, Maritza Westervelt, was a witness to the above and described the same course of events. E. Westervelt and M. Westervelt both completed Voluntary statement Forms. This case is closed as it was determined E. Westervelt shot the hog due to its aggressive behavior. No further information.
